# LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Today was a busy day for the House Committees with a number of bills considered.

- passed SB533 increased funds for drug treatment
- passed SB433 permits certain overweight vehicles from traveling over
- state roads during spring weight limit period to include Septic trucks
  killed SB535 establishing a grant program for high schools for heroin and opiate prevention education

• passed SB509 which changes the procedure for investigating new voters who do not confirm their status after receiving letters of identity verification.

- $\bullet$  killed SB492 modifies the allocation of rebates to retail electric customers
- Passed SB521 which sets fees for OHRVs

• Passed SB489 authorizing a demonstration project using a Stirling engine system.

# Guest BRIAN SOWYRDA, Field and Training Director for the NHDP

He explained the NHDP's Training4Success program, which will have two training sessions for Grafton County.
